






BC Wildfire Map July 17, 2017

- Consistent signage and messages (sign fatigue)










BC Housing became involved in Rapid Damage Assessment after the 1989 San Francisco earthquake. "We estimated that when a similar event happens here, more than a half million people may evacuate their homes," noted Streen Bibby, "Because we're a component of the emergency social service system, BC Housing might have to help provide emergency lodging. Even with a small amount of chamage, people might think their homes are unsafe."
